Meeting called to order 7:01 by President Lynn Glowenlock

Treasurers Report:

- \$20,683.12 balance at start of year
- Expenses: BBQ, instruments (acquired 12 new instruments: 3 trumpet, 1 cornet, 3 clarinet, 2 bass sax, 2 tenor sax, 1 flute for total of \$2,300)
- Current balance around \$17,000
- Schedule of charges for Portland trip not yet set, but almost everyone is now being contacted through email

Schedule changes:

- Band Booster meeting moved to Monday, November 1st
- Concert moved to Wednesday, November 3rd
- Reason for changes due to schedule needing to have been submitted late last March/early April and the school calendar was then changed to start a week early, pushing the concert into the next quarter. Wednesday was chosen over Monday to allow for student class time after the four day weekend, created by conferences

Fundraisers:

- V.P. Shawna clarifies the two kinds of fundraisers that the BB host: communal fundraiser for the general fund or specific goal (transportation cost, instruments, etc.) that is of benefit to the whole group or Individual where students may fund an individual account to pay for trip costs
- Sees candies
 - Two site sales set up, both at Kingston ferry dock: weekend of Oct. 9/10 and Oct. 23/24
 - Sign up in band room, each shift needs one parent volunteer and 2 kids
 - Each shift two hours, except the last one that is one hour
 - Table set up on walk-way and kids will walk in the ferry lanes with vests
 - Money raised will go specifically to cut transportation costs (Portland trip, parades, jazz competition)
 - Can check out boxes of candy bars for individual sales
 - Heidi Brislin is the fundraiser captain for Sees

Question: How much is the fundraiser goal for the general fund?

-Transportation costs change from year to year, and the quotes for this year are not in. The Viking Fest and Armed Forces Parade transportation cost has historically been between \$600-\$800

The band program is given an allotted amount of money from the district that must cover transportation, instruments and their repair, as well as substitute teachers

- Photography session: parent offering professional photos of students in uniform with instruments as a fundraiser for the general fund, proposed in time for Christmas gifts-maybe hold photo sessions during conferences
- Mary Kay (drill team has used in past)-more info to come-proposed as individual
- Bread Dough: November 3rd order forms, delivered at December concert
- McTakeover at McDonalds December 8th: looking into coupon book presales and will need adult volunteers
- Jun Thomas' Dad offers the use of his espresso cart for fundraising

Portland trip: Wed, June 8th, Received *official invite* from Mr. Chin, Chairman of Bands, today

Approval still needed from principal, superintendent, and school board

To make the marching band, students need to show potential, the ability to play, and also look

Good while marching - Attempts to teach "life skills"

Practice slips due Monday: demonstrates improperly filled out practice slips- no name, no

parent signature

Uniforms: 1st concert 1 month away- students need to acquire band uniform of black docker

Style pants, long sleeved white dress shirt, black tie, black shoes

Reason for same shoes for marching band was due to requirements made by Disneyland for

Uniform band appearance

Cannot lease private coach to Portland due to contract obligations in school district

Distances travelled over 500 miles allow for competitor bidding

Portland:

Leave after lunch, drive to Portland, arrive at hotel, then to Bullwinkles

Chaperones ride bus down with students, trips not required for grade

Stay only one night

Question: What do you do with sick child on trip?

A nurse is in attendance on trip to administer medications, and there is a chaperone with each

Group, and students can be shuffled between chaperones to allow for coverage of all

Students, including a student who may need to stay at the hotel
